Netball NSW, together with Associations across the state, work together to:

- Deliver a representative competition recognised as a progression on the Netball NSW performance pathway.
- Bring athletes from around NSW together to compete for their Association and crown a state champion.
- Provide a fun and encouraging environment for athletes and umpires to develop their skills and potential.
- Introduce junior athletes to the foundations of fundamental movement and core technical skills.
- Create a sense of belonging to an Association community that builds commitment and loyalty.
- Provide opportunities for coaches, managers and support staff to grow and develop.
- Deliver a positive first experience, so athletes stay in the sport and enjoy its lifelong physical, psychological and social benefits.
- Promote a sports culture where winning matters — but development matters more — and where every player matters.
