The 2026 season starts Saturday 2 May at Heffron Park

Opening Day — Saturday 2 May 2026

Mark the calendar, wear your club colours and get down to Heffron Park! Opening Day is going to be a celebration of everything we love about Randwick Netball — the community, the kids, the coaches, the families and the game itself.

What's happening on the day

- **8:00 am** First games of the 2026 season get under way
- **9:00 am** Official Opening Ceremony — every club to assemble in front of the Club House for the Parade of Clubs
- **9:00 am** Marching band, annual award presentations, and the Walk of Fame induction of Gabi Simpson

We are honoured that Mayor Dylan Parker will officially open the season, and that Gabi Simpson — one of our homegrown Australian Diamonds — will be inducted into the Randwick Netball Walk of Fame in front of her family, her club and her community. These are the moments that make our Association special.

What's new at Heffron Park

Working alongside Randwick City Council, we have some fantastic upgrades to share — and you will feel the benefit of these from your very first game:

The Walk of Fame is getting a facelift

One of the most loved spots at Heffron — where families gather, kids chase each other, and players warm up before their game — is getting a beautiful new look. Final surface graphics have been designed with DecoPave and Artscape, celebrating our Diamonds and the Randwick Netball story. Work is due to be completed ahead of Opening Day, and it looks stunning.

More warm-up goal posts

Extra warm-up posts have been installed across the park, so more of our players can get their goal practice in before they run onto court. A small thing — but if you've ever queued for a pre-game shot, you'll love this one.

Safer courts

Council has completed the run-off areas behind Courts A, B and C, and at the end of Court 13, which means safer play for everyone — especially when the ball goes out of bounds at pace.

New amenities block — coming this season!

The new amenities block is on track for completion at the end of July — ahead of schedule — which means our members will get to enjoy the new facilities during this very season. Something to look forward to as Winter rolls on.

Lest we forget — ANZAC Day 2026

On Saturday 25 April, Randwick Netball was proudly represented at the Randwick ANZAC Day Dawn Service at Goldstein Reserve. Lily Ennes, recipient of our President's Medal, and Judy Capovilla, recipient of the Pat Martin Service Award, laid the wreath on behalf of our Association.

It was a beautiful and moving morning, and the representation of our Association at Randwick City Council's official commemorations is something we take enormous pride in. A heartfelt thank you to Lily and Judy for representing us with such grace and dignity.

E-Scoring is here — and it's a game changer

2026 marks the season we move to E-Scoring across all our competitions, through PlayHQ. Here's what this means for you:

- Live scores available on your phone as games are played
- Faster and more accurate ladders and results
- Parents and family members can follow your games even when they can't make it court-side

A huge thank you to Tanya Coleman for leading this enormous rollout, running our training sessions, and coordinating the whole process. And thank you to every club who has embraced the change — this is the kind of progress that keeps our Association moving forward.

NetSetGo — now on Saturday mornings too!

Our youngest and newest players are in for a treat in 2026. In addition to the existing Tuesday afternoon sessions, NetSetGo is now running on Saturday mornings on Court A — with three games going simultaneously across the thirds.

Why does that matter? Because it means more touches, more shots, more confidence, and more fun for the little ones who are just starting their netball journey. This is where it all begins — and there is nothing more heartwarming than watching a first-timer score their very first goal.

A huge thank you to Sasha for coordinating the NetSetGo programme so beautifully — setting the tone for how welcoming and joyful netball should feel from day one. And to Woolworths, via Westfield, for their wonderful ongoing grassroots support.

Play Like a Girl — Saturday 9 May

Just one week after Opening Day, we host our annual 'Play Like a Girl' day — supporting the Women's Cancer Unit at the Royal Hospital for Women. This cause is close to our Association's heart, and the way our community rallies behind it every year is genuinely moving.

New for 2026, we will have RNA drink bottles and RNA socks on sale — with \$5.00 from every item sold donated directly to the Women's Cancer Unit. Our hoodies, hats and balls will also be available. Come down, get behind the cause, and let's make this year's Play Like a Girl the biggest one yet.

Our Representative Teams — season under way

14 representative teams across junior, senior and metro divisions have been training their hearts out over the off-season, and the first rounds are now under way.

We could not be prouder of our Metro Squads — the depth of talent and commitment across all four teams is something truly special.

One of my proudest moments each season is watching our Premier League and Metro League girls step into coaching roles with our junior rep teams. Senior athletes giving back to the next generation — young players learning from athletes who have walked the same road. This is exactly how the pathway is meant to work, and it tells you everything about the culture of this Association.

Our rep girls are also giving back through four volunteer hours across the season — at coaches' workshops, NetSetGo sessions, the BBQ, scoring, the canteen, setting up the park. And what has absolutely warmed our hearts is that many are asking for more hours, not fewer. That's the Randwick Netball spirit right there.
