



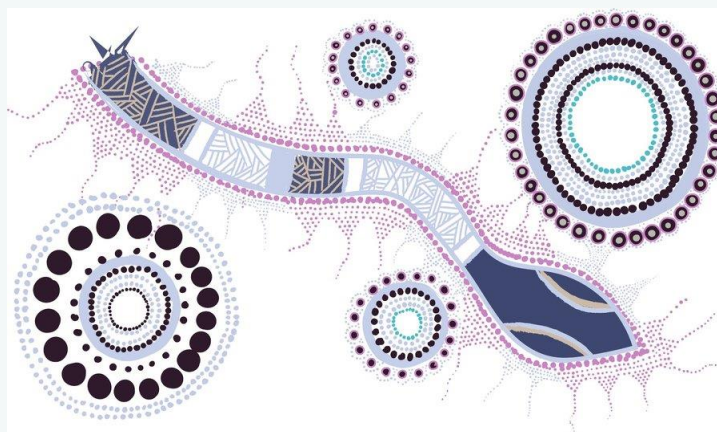

Shop the Gilbert First Nations Range — On Court Saturday

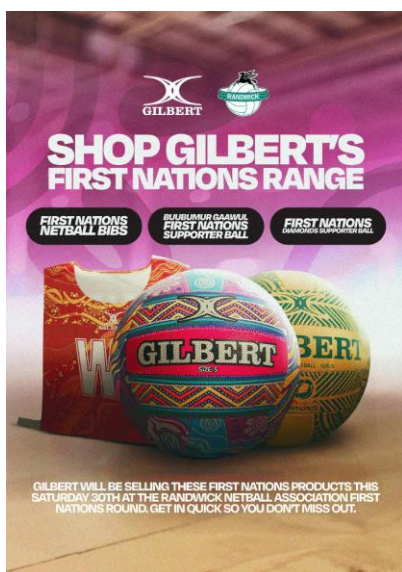
